MISSION STATEMENT

To provide the highest quality engineering and geographical information services to the City of Hendersonville and those who are served by the City of Hendersonville infrastructure. This mission will be achieved through the communication and efforts of our staff with the public and those who work to serve the public.

ENGINEERING - This group helps plan, review, design and manage City infrastructure projects including water distribution, sewer collection, roadways, streetscapes, stormwater systems, sidewalks and greenways. Some recent projects include the Main Street Improvements, Oklawaha Greenway and Jackson Park Sewer. The group consists of Brent Detwiler (Director), Marlee Page, Mark Pomraning and Brendan Shanahan.

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT - Keith Fogo and Chris Terry manage and inspect a wide range of projects from start to finish to ensure adherence to plans, specifications and all applicable standards. These projects include water, sewer, sidewalk, roads, streetscapes, greenways, stormwater and stream restoration.

GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEMS (GIS) - GIS is used to analyze and display geographic (spatial) data in digital form. The City of Hendersonville's Engineering Department maintains GIS for use by the City's staff. Data maintained by City staff includes political boundaries, zoning, infrastructure systems (water systems, sewer systems, stormwater), and other associated data pertaining to city operations. Travis Penland is the Geographic Information Systems Administrator.

STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PROGRAM - Works to preserve, protect, and restore the quality of water in the streams, rivers, and lakes within the City of Hendersonville. The City's Stormwater Management program was developed to reduce pollution generated from stormwater runoff. The City of Hendersonville is a federally designated National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Phase II community and operates under the authority of the Stormwater Management Program which became effective in August of 2007 after being drafted into the city's Code of Ordinances and operates as a division of the Engineering Department. Michael Huffman is the Storm Water Administrator.
