CITY TIMELINE

1838 – Henderson County is formed from the large Buncombe County. Named for Judge Leonard Henderson of Granville County, NC

1847 – Town of Hendersonville charter adopted

1882 – First Mayor, Dr. T.A. Allen, elected

1885 – City purchases land for municipal cemetery, Oakdale

1888 – Small water reservoir, with generator, built in Finley cove area

1893 – Town Hall and Opera House completed mid-way between 5th and 4th Avenues on the east side of Main Street

1913 – Name change from Town of Hendersonville to City of Hendersonville

1918 – Second water intake near Crystal Springs in Laurel Park built

1920s – Original sewer lines constructed transporting untreated wastewater into Mud Creek

1922 – North Fork intake dam completed (still in use today) and 17 miles of pipe laid thru Pisgah Forest to the Ewart Hill Reservoir

1927 – Bradley Creek Dam completed (still in use today)

1928 – Current City Hall opens housing all departments including the jail, courtroom, and health department.

1960 – City builds Water & Sewer building at 415 8th Avenue East (now Guidon Brewery)

1962 – WWTP on Balfour Road opens

1963 – Current WTP constructed

1960s – (late) Police Department moves to the former Times-News Building, where the Apple parking lot is today

1970s – Water & Sewer Department moves to Spartanburg Hwy next to Joy Drive-In. Public Works moves into building on 8th Avenue (now Guidon Brewery)

1972 – Patton Pool opens.

1980 – WTP expands

1990s – Water & Sewer Department moves into the Mill Building. W & S customer service moves from the Police Building on 6th Avenue to a building across from the Mill (now courthouse parking)

2000 – Fire Department moves out of City Hall to Fire Station #1

2002 – New WWTP opens across Balfour Road from original plant

2003 – City Operations Center opens joining W&S, Public Works and Engineering in one location

2003 – The admin, planning and finance employees move out of City Hall and into the Water & Sewer Building across from Mill Building.

2005 – The newly renovated City Hall reopens.

2010 – Renovation of WTP

2014 – Fire Station #2 opens on Sugarloaf Road.
