## *Police Department Vehicles*

The Police Department fleet is comprised of 63 cars, SUV's, and trucks, 5 motorcycles, and a golf cart.

The bulk of our fleet are marked vehicles, consisting of 6 Ford sedans, 11 Dodge sedans, 23 Ford SUV's, 1 Dodge SUV, and 2 Ford Trucks used for animal enforcement. The other unmarked vehicles are a mix of Ford, Dodge, and Chevrolet and assigned to detectives and administration.

Most marked vehicles have the following equipment installed, valued at \$16,000 dollars:

- Prisoner partition
- Prisoner transport seat
- Specialized console with computer stand
- Laptop computer
- Printer
- Radar
- Mobile radio
- Camera system
- Siren
- Blue Lights
- Weapon rack
- Stop sticks

The Animal Enforcement trucks are equipped with additional special equipment including a dual transport animal box, tranquilizer gun, laser thermometer, animal harnesses, and other miscellaneous equipment.

Several marked and unmarked spare vehicles are kept at the motor pool for use by reserve officers and other officers when their vehicles are being repaired or serviced.

The motor fleet consists of all Harley Davidsons and are equipped with lights, siren, radio, and radars. The motors are used primarily for traffic enforcement and for special events. Specialized training is required to operate a police motor.

The golf cart is used for Main Street and 7th Avenue patrols and special events.

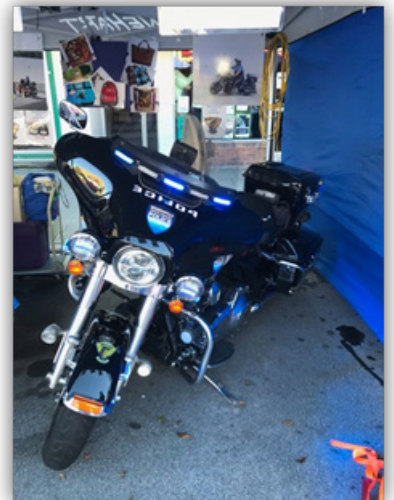
